Sustainability Corner

Thank you to our staff and families for your continuous support with our **containers for change** collection. So far we have raised \$158.36!! 

For all our new families, the collection bin is located at the entrance of the centre. Our **bottle top hill** collection bin is also located here.

What does bottle top hill do?

- **Recycle:** Sort and send items like bottle tops and bread tags to specialized programs (e.g., for road base, plant pots, or to create wheelchairs).
- **Educate:** Host monthly events with themes like plastic-free living, repair, and reducing waste, involving schools and community groups.
- **Create Awareness:** Promote sustainable behaviors and highlight how small items can be part of a larger circular economy.
- **Support Other Programs:** Serve as a central collection point for initiatives like [Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs](#).

In essence, Bottle Top Hill provides a crucial service for items not accepted in standard kerbside recycling, fostering community engagement and tangible environmental action in the Perth area.
